I recently read a book entitled "A Big Gospel in Small Places: Why Ministry in Forgotten Communities Matters" written by Pastor Stephen Witmer. It made me appreciate the ministry done by Emmanuel Lutheran in this small (perhaps even forgotten) place called Gackle. In his book, Witner talks about some characteristics of fruitful small place ministry; many of which I see at Emmanuel.

The first is being a listening church and creating a culture of listening among the members. The art of listening is way more than hearing the words that are being said verbally. It's also paying attention to the non-verbal gestures that often accompany those words. It is truly knowing our neighbors and what is important to them. It knows Gackle's history, its values, its struggles, its needs, its triumphs and its aspirations. It's also knowing our church in that same intimate way. As we love our community, our church, and our neighbors, we put their needs ahead of our own.

Another important characteristic in fruitful small place ministry is being a celebrating church. "Celebrations are one of the most important identity shapers for small towns" (Witner, pg.123). For the past several years, we have come to Gackle for the July 4th festivities. It's fun to re-connect during all the events that take place that day. As Emmanuel takes part in these celebrations, it shows how important the citizens of Gackle are to us and hopefully we are to them. What might be other ways can we celebrate with those who work in our community? Have we ever thought about an appreciation dinner for the fire department, the city workers, or the teachers in our school?

Finally, we need to be a proclaiming church. It's not enough to be a local, listening, serving, and celebrating church. To be the church, we must proclaim the gospel which shapes and transforms us. We know what goes on in our church service, but is our service welcoming to someone not familiar with Lutheran liturgy? Do we use insider language and words that only Lutherans understand? That was the beauty of trying "Messy Church!" It's introducing the gospel in a different way, by being a place where people can gather often around a meal or a cup of coffee. It's a program of activities that help us know one another on a deeper basis, especially those who might not regularly attend a regular service. Even though it's unlike our usual expectations of a worship service, Messy Church is always centered around Christ with a short bible story and prayer as part of our time together. Is it different? Yes, it certainly is. Does it require us to change? Only in the format! For Jesus is the same, yesterday, today, and forever! Thanks be to God!

Duties of the Ushers

(reviewed on 3/2022)

- 1. Arrive at church 30 minutes prior to service.
- 2. Turn Sanctuary lights on and off before and after service.
- 3. Raise and lower shades on windows before and after service.
- 4. Put up hymn numbers (numbers are in room to left of altar in cupboard).
- 5. Turn on the Cross at altar (switch is labeled in room to the right of altar).
- 6. Turn lamps on for the Lectern and Pulpit. Turn off after service.
- 7. Fill ceramic pitcher with water and place on baptismal font along with silver bowl that goes in the baptismal font (pitcher and bowl are located in room to the left of altar on the counter by sink).
- 8. Hand out bulletins, newsletters, etc.
- 9. Ring church bell at least 3 times just before beginning of the service.
- 10. Count the number of people attending the service (easily done from the balcony sometime after service has begun) (number in attendance is to be written in the book which is in the fellowship hall).
- 11. Receive offering plates, gathering offering, and bring offering forward when pastor signals.
- 12. Usher people forward for Holy Communion (one usher stands towards the front to allow worshipers to advance to front).
- 13. Usher people out when church service has concluded.
