The Joy of Discipleship

Over the past month, our gospel texts from Luke take us on a journey with Jesus; a journey where Jesus teaches the disciples and others what it means to follow Jesus. It's not always easy to follow and we make many mistakes along the way, but thanks be to God, we belong to a God who loves us, forgives us, and lets us start over again.

Michael Foss in his book, <u>The Disciple's Joy</u>, talks about six practices for spiritual growth. As I read this book, I wondered if this pastor was writing from the gospel of Luke for there were many similarities. Jesus taught his disciples how to pray, what it means to serve our neighbor, and that remembering to love God and one another needs to be central in our faith journey. Our relationship with God should be a priority in our lives for God is all-knowing, all-powerful, and always present as we live day by day. We can come to God with anything, at any time, and anywhere. A relationship, however, is not just one-sided. Are we willing to let God lead our lives in that same way...with anything, at anytime and anywhere?

Foss, in his book, states we simply cannot grow in our relationship with God if we do not tend to that relationship and if we do not allow God to send us out into the world. This inward-outward movement of faith continues throughout our lives. When Foss talks about inward movement, his focus is on three personal disciplines that help us grow deeper in faith: daily prayer, weekly worship, and daily bible readings. "Daily prayer creates within us the vision to see God at work within our world as well as the ability to trust that God is at work when we cannot see it clearly." (p.63-64). Prayer gives us a new perspective on the ordinary realities of life. Worship, our second discipline, is that sacred moment when each person gathered meets the Risen Savior. As we sing and pray and say our liturgies together, we are often transformed about our understanding of who God is. In worship, we place ourselves in the presence of a God who calls us to follow Jesus in ways that are pleasing to God. "The person who says that they love God and yet does not regularly participate in corporate worship is like the man who says he loves his wife but never spends any real time getting to know her, letting her get to know him. Love is just an abstract idea with no power to touch the life of the other or sustain the relationship when temptations come or life gets hard." (p. 72).

The third inward movement is daily Bible readings. The benefits of daily reading in God's word include the courage to stand up for what ultimately matters. We live in a time when inner strength and courage are vital. We face many temptations in today's world and the grounding of the Bible provides a place to stand when struggles of complex issues arise. However, the crisis of Biblical illiteracy is of real concern. If we don't spend time in God's Word, how can we know the Christ-like stand to take? This Biblical illiteracy will only end when Christians begin to read the Bible in light of the questions that trouble and challenge us as we live and work in our complex world.

Well, I'm out of space for this month. I'll continue with the other three outward movements and disciplines next time. Until then, I hope you will consider how these three disciplines apply to you.



Duties of the Ushers

(reviewed on 3/2022)

- 1. Arrive at church 30 minutes prior to service.
- 2. Turn Sanctuary lights on and off before and after service.
- 3. Raise and lower shades on windows before and after service.
- 4. Put up hymn numbers (numbers are in room to left of altar in cupboard).
- 5. Turn on the Cross at altar (switch is labeled in room to the right of altar).
- 6. Turn lamps on for the Lectern and Pulpit. Turn off after service.
- 7. Fill ceramic pitcher with water and place on baptismal font along with silver bowl that goes in the baptismal font (pitcher and bowl are located in room to the left of altar on the counter by sink).
- 8. Hand out bulletins, newsletters, etc.
- 9. Ring church bell at least 3 times just before beginning of the service.
- 10. Count the number of people attending the service (easily done from the balcony sometime after service has begun) (number in attendance is to be written in the book which is in the fellowship hall).
- 11. Receive offering plates, gathering offering, and bring offering forward when pastor signals.
- 12. Usher people forward for Holy Communion (one usher stands towards the front to allow worshipers to advance to front).
- 13. Usher people out when church service has concluded.
